International students and speakers of other languages are supported in many ways here at Ringling College of Art and Design. We know that our home, Sarasota, Florida, has a culture different to that of the 65 countries represented by our international students, and the ESOL Program faculty and staff understand that adapting to a culture different from your own takes some adjustment. We are here to support your academic acculturation. The ESOL Program offers ESOL classes and English language tutoring to students whose first language is not English.

OUR PROGRAMS

Our comprehensive ESOL Programs are designed to introduce non-native English speakers to the resources available to them on campus while also building writing, reading, speaking, and listening proficiency and outlining classroom expectations and etiquette. Our programs provide students with opportunities to explore the language and prepare for success in their Studio and Liberal Arts courses. From vocabulary practice to discussions and presentations, students can take the skills directly from our programs to their studio classes and their Liberal Arts classes to join and participate in the communities of their majors.

Programs include:

- ESL SKILLS TO CONNECT STUDENTS WITH CAMPUS SERVICES AND STAFF
- WRITING STUDIO TO ENHANCE READING AND WRITING PROFICIENCY

ESL Skills: Joining the Ringling Community is a onesemester course created to introduce international ESOL students to the resources and nuances of life at Ringling College. This course introduces students to campus resources such as Career Services, the Academic Resource Center, the Library, and the Health Center. As part of the Ringling Community, you will feel comfortable approaching each of these departments when necessary throughout your time at the College.

ESL Skills is designed to:

PLACEMENT & ASSESSMENT

Placement into ESL Skills is determined by the ESOL Program Coordinator and ESOL faculty. During Orientation, new international students take a listening and speaking assessment and complete a writing placement essay. The program staff also take into account TOEFL scores and other criteria from a student's admissions file as appropriate. Program faculty and Advising staff work closely together to place students in classes that best suit their needs and ensure their success. Class placement is smooth and seamless: if you are to take ESL Skills, you will know before the first day of classes.
