In January 2018, EAC will host an exhibition entitled *Change of Pace*. Participants in this experimental exhibition will create work through the summer and fall. The concept is for an artist to create two artworks for the show, one in the “regular” media of their creative practice and one in a different media, a media that is a “change of pace” for that artist. Both pieces should be thematically similar to each other – with at least one element being recognizable in each work; but there is no set theme for the exhibition.

The format for the exhibition is experimental for EAC and designed to encourage artists to experiment with expanding and enriching their creativity, while providing a fun and contemplative art viewing experience for cultural enthusiasts and curious visitors.
