The ESOL Program offers ESOL classes and English language tutoring to students whose first language is not English.

Our Program

Our comprehensive ESOL Program is designed to introduce non-native English speakers to the resources available on campus while also building writing, reading, speaking, and listening proficiency and outlining academic expectations. Our program provides students with opportunities to explore the language and prepare for success in their Studio and Liberal Arts courses. From vocabulary practice to discussions and presentations, students can take the skills directly from our program to their studio classes and their Liberal Arts classes to join and participate in the communities of their majors.

Our Program includes:

- Critical Skills for English Language to connect students with campus services and staff
- Writing Studio to enhance reading and writing proficiency

Critical Skills for English Language Learners is a onesemester course created to introduce ESOL students to the resources and nuances of life at Ringling College. This course introduces students to campus resources such as Career Services, the Student Learning Center, the Library, and the Health Center. As part of the Ringling Community, you will feel comfortable approaching each of these departments when necessary throughout your time at the College.

Critical Skills for English Language Learners is designed to:

- Improve classroom and campus life experience
- · Strengthen communication with faculty and staff
- Introduce American academic culture and expectations

Thirty to forty percent of our international student population takes this course to ease the transition of studying in a new country.

ESOL Program Placement and Assessment

Placement into Critical Skills for English Language Learners is determined by the ESOL Program Coordinator and ESOL faculty. Before students arrive to campus, international students take a listening and speaking assessment. The program staff also take into account TOEFL scores and other criteria from a student's admissions file as appropriate. Program faculty and Advising staff work together to place students in classes that best suit their needs and ensure their success.
