Das Oktoberfest **CONCEPT**

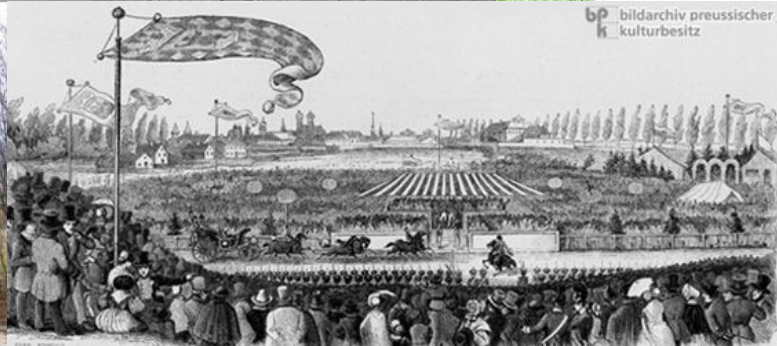

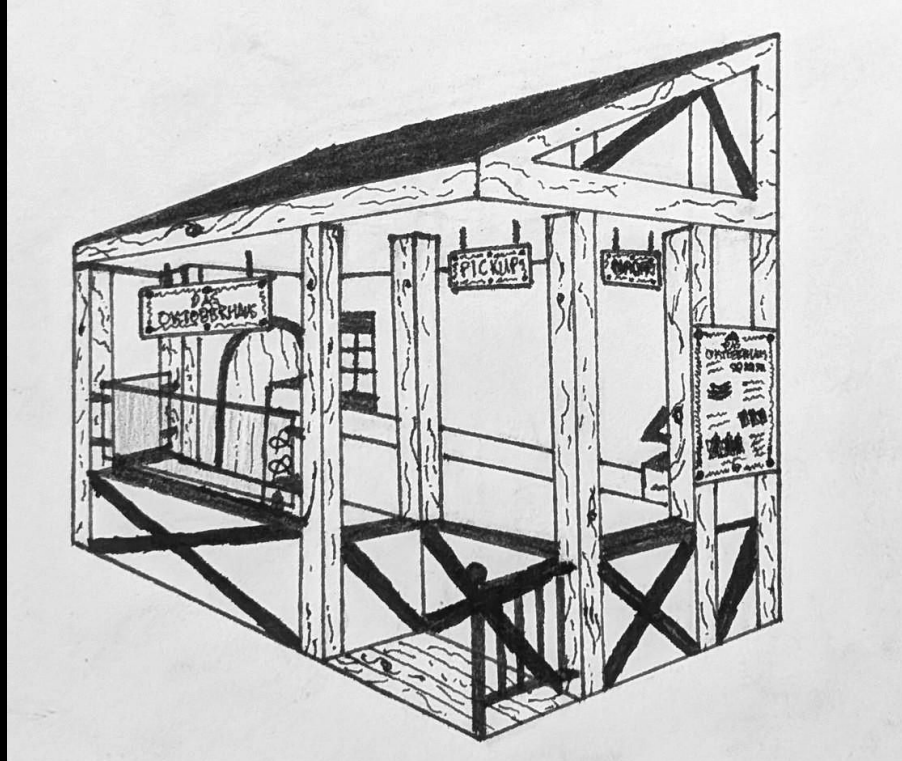

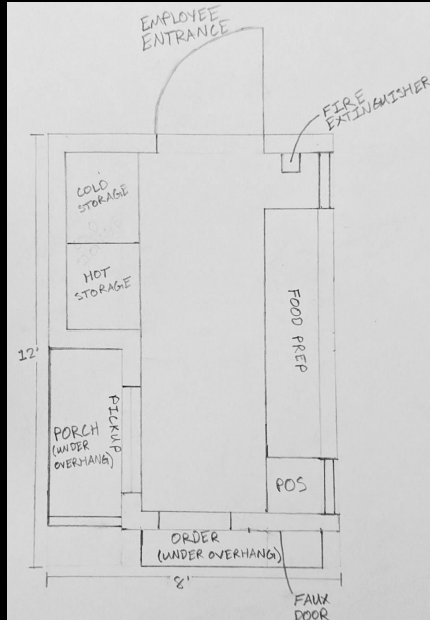




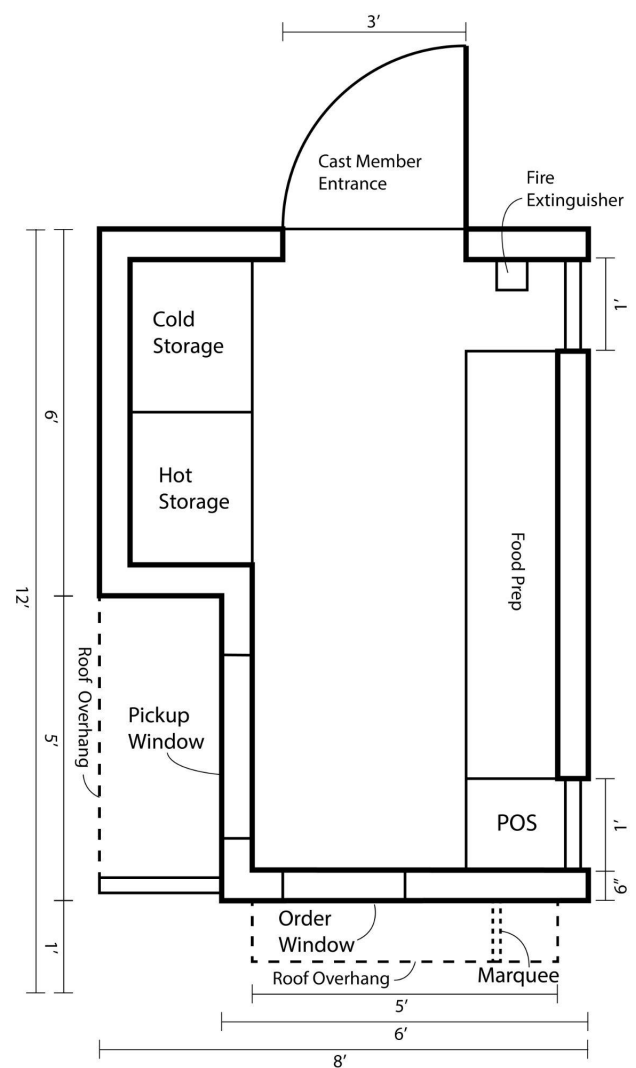
PERSPECTIVE Drawing



Ground PLAN

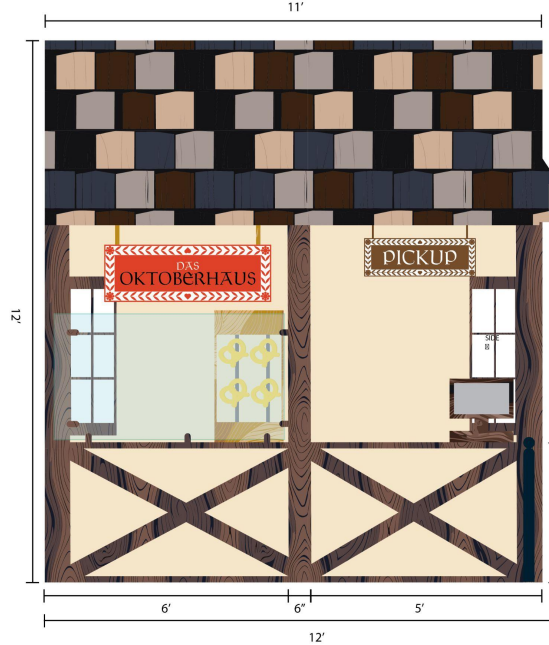


I drew the ground plan by hand and traced it in Illustrator, using guides to make it dimensionally accurate.

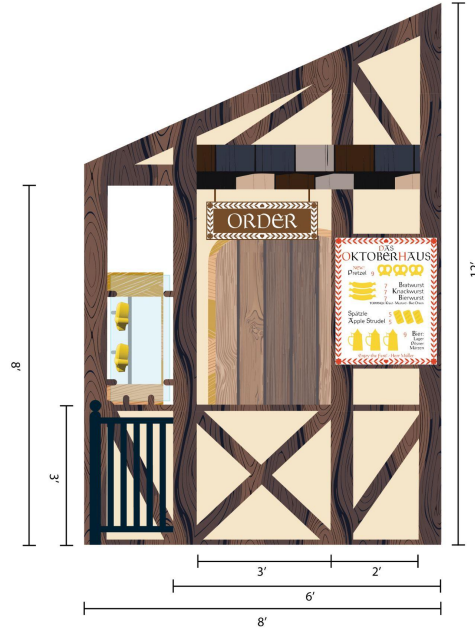


Elevations

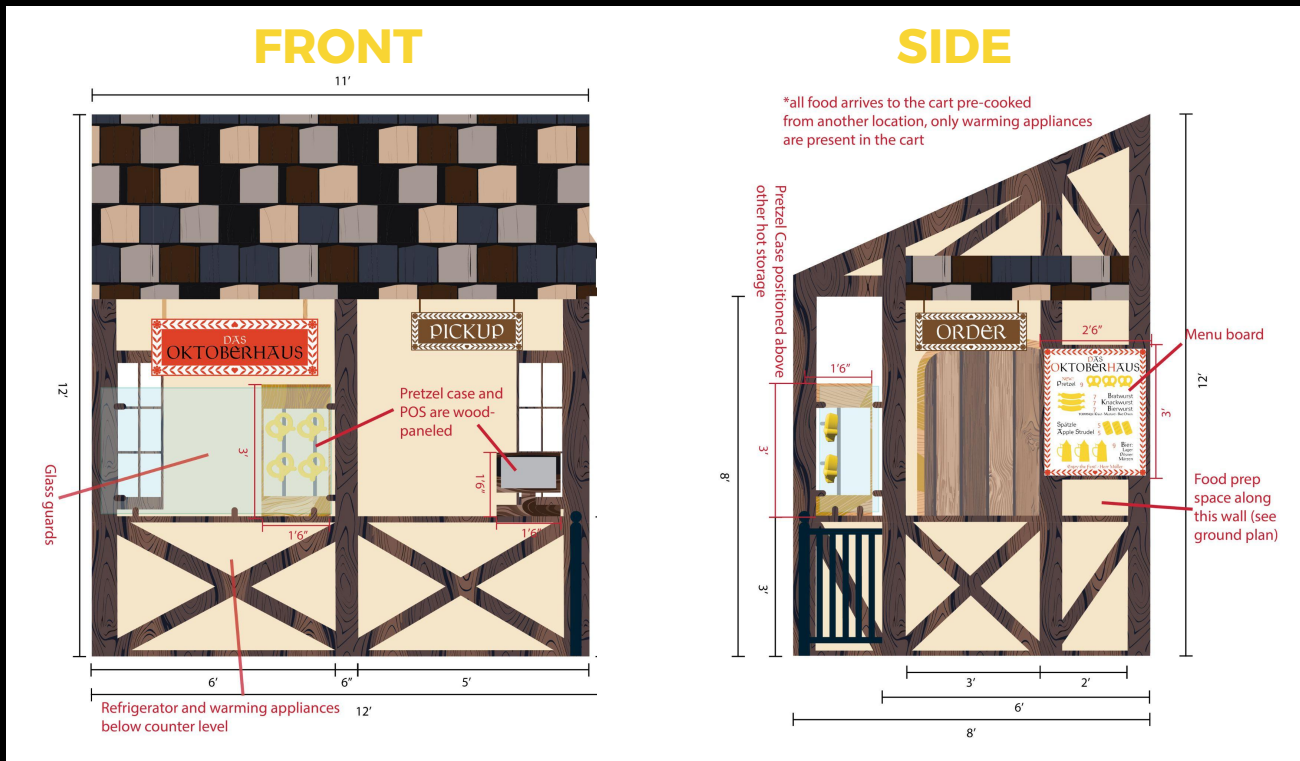
