The Fine Arts department is an intimate program with limited enrollment. It provides individual attention and fosters a tight-knit community of artists. The curriculum includes critical thinking, painting, sculpture, printmaking, photography, and new media. Students will master technical and conceptual skills, explore innovative modes of expression, and develop an awareness of the historical and contemporary context of their work.

Our outstanding program prepares students for success in the \$67 billion international art industry. Students can apply for their own studio space, and are provided with state-of-the-art facilities and a multitude of exhibition opportunities at Crossley Gallery and across campus. Graduates of the program have gone on to become critically acclaimed artists with national and international representation, industry creatives, and entrepreneurs.

Alumni Success

Our Fine Arts graduates have gone on to major careers and success in the arts. As professional artists, they have exhibited at top galleries and museums across the country and around the world, including in New York, Los Angeles, Paris, and London, with their work reviewed by the industry's top publications and critics. Graduates have their work in private collections and have received numerous accolades, awards, and grants, such as the Pollock-Krasner Foundation Grant, Guggenheim Fellowship, and Joan Mitchell Fellowship. Our alumni have also continued on to elite MFA programs at Yale, Columbia, Bard, and CalArts, among others.

Concentrations

Fine Arts majors have the opportunity to choose a concentration of focus in one of the following areas:

Painting

Through intensive study in observational painting and contemporary approaches, students in the Painting Concentration develop technical skills, visual literacy, and a personal aesthetic voice.

Photography and Media Arts

This concentration provides students with a strong foundation in lens-based media, emphasizing both creative expression and technical proficiency, through hands-on work in digital and analog photography and video production.

Sculpture and Expanded Media

This concentration offers an interdisciplinary approach to three-dimensional and time-based art practices, from traditional sculptural processes to contemporary strategies in installation, performance, and digital media.

Print Media

The Print Media concentration offers students a comprehensive exploration of traditional and contemporary print processes, including intaglio, lithography, screen printing, and digital techniques.

Facilities and Studio Space

We have exceptional facilities spread across campus. Studios North is the creative hub exclusive to Fine Arts where students have access to their own private studio spaces. Additional state-of-the-art facilities at the Basch Visual Arts Center and the Hammonds Sculpture building include dedicated spaces for printmaking and woodworking, metal fabrication, 3D printing, glass blowing, and more.

Exhibition Opportunities

Crossley Gallery, is exclusive to the Fine Arts Department and administered by our students. It provides our students with real world, first-hand experience developing gallery programs and curating professional exhibitions.

Business of Art and Design and Minors

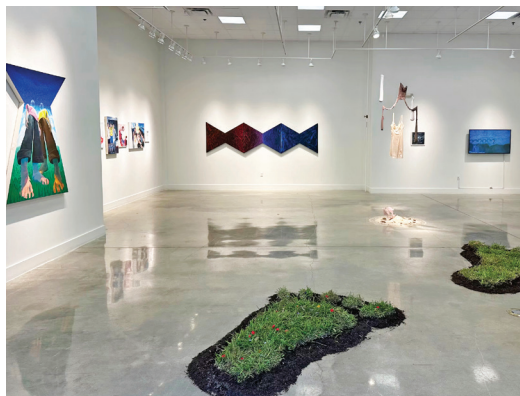
